PigTrace for Backyard Production

Request a PigTrace Account:

PigTrace accounts can be requested by one of the following:

- (1) Go to www.pigtrace.ca, then select “Request a PigTrace Account” and complete the form (or go direct to <https://pigtrace.traceability.ca/login/request-account>), or
- (2) Contact PigTrace customer service at 1-866-300-1825, or
- (3) Contact your provincial pork organization (<http://pigtrace.ca/provincial-contacts/>)

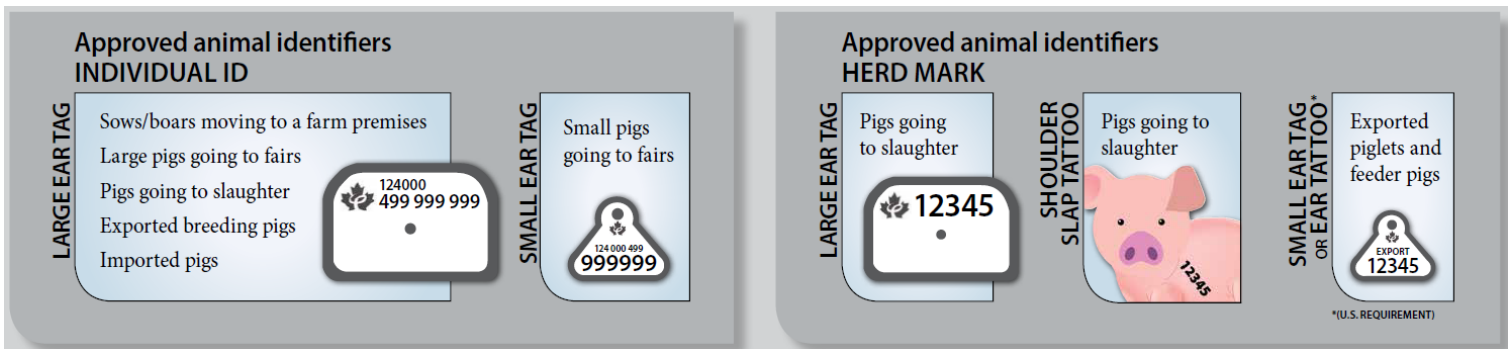
Requirements:

- (1) **Report all incoming and outgoing pig movements to the PigTrace system**
 - can report by: logging into pigtrace.ca (computer or mobile), fax, phone
 - must have registered account through PigTrace or via provincial pork organization
 - information to report:
 - origin and destination
 - date & time of departure or reception
 - license plate of vehicle or trailer (if tandem unit)
 - number of pigs
 - animal identification (*where applicable, see below)
 - contact 1-866-300-1825 or your provincial pork organization to learn more
- (2) **Animal identification only required for certain types of movements**
 - Weaners and feeder pigs going from a **farm to another farm** do not require animal identification (note: sows and boars require the PigTrace Individual ID ear tag)
 - pigs going to **slaughter** must have either:
 - Herd Mark shoulder slap tattoo
 - PigTrace Herd Mark ear tag
 - PigTrace Individual ID ear tag
 - the PigTrace Individual ID ear tag must be used (i.e., is the only option) when:
 - pigs are imported
 - pigs go to fair, exhibition or auction
 - sows or boars move from one farm to another farm
 - pigs being **exported** must have any form of PigTrace ear tag or a Herd Mark ear tattoo (feeder pigs only)

The program provides two options for pig identification:

- The **herd mark** is a 5-digit number assigned to a farm. It can only be used for slaughter or export movements, as it must identify the last farm of residence before slaughter or export. The herd mark may also be applied as a shoulder slap tattoo (slaughter) or ear tattoo (exported feeder pigs).
- The **individual ID** is a unique number specific to every pig, and can be used to identify pigs going anywhere.

Potential options for backyard production:

- (1) Backyard producers who buy piglets for feeding and eventual slaughter can identify pigs in preparation for slaughter by applying a:
 - Herd Mark shoulder slap tattoo at the time of shipping to slaughter,
 - PigTrace ear tag at a young age (small or large tag with either ID format), or
 - PigTrace ear tag at time of slaughter (*not recommended, as it's a fresh wound that is often chewed on by other pigs. Also, tagging 100+ pound pigs may not be much fun!).
- (2) Sow farms that sell piglets to backyard producers for further growing **could** apply individual ID tags (small piglet tag) before shipping/selling to customers. Customers would then already have pig identification for eventual slaughter.
 - Potential solution for farms that do not have taggers (\$25) or tattooing equipment (~\$80).
 - *PigTrace can now offer tag orders of less than 25 through its inventories at most provincial pork offices.
